How to: download e-books



In case you would like to use our <u>online library from home/remotely</u>: Prepare by establishing a **VPN connection** with **OTH**.

You want to access our e-books from outside the OTH Amberg-Weiden campus?

All you need is a virtual connection to the campus network.

To establish that virtual connection, **download and configurate the software** <u>FortiClient</u>. It is available for Windows, Apple and Linux.

Good, you're connected (or directly at OTH campus). What's next?

The first thing to do is to find out if we have an e-book on the topic or title you need in our collection. To do this, simply search our OPAC for your topic or title and/or author. The hit list might look like the following and already give you some important clues (next page):

When looking up titles, you'll recognize e-books like this:





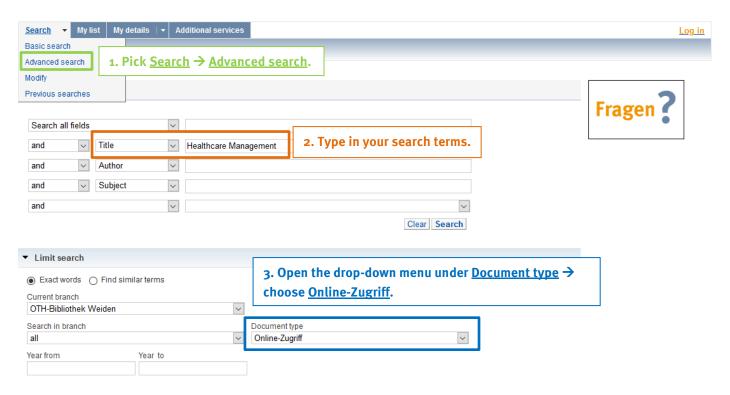


E-books that are available for download will exclusively be shown in our local catalogues. You cannot order e-books via interlibrary loan! However, you can always order a printed copy if we cannot provide access to the e-book!

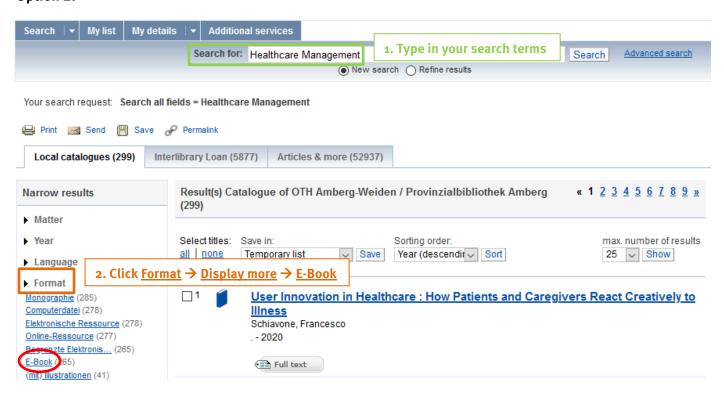
Looking for e-books specifically:

What to do to only be shown e-books in your search results? There's **two options**: Either modify your settings **before (Option 1)** or **after (Option 2)** you send your search request.

Almost there: Download

So you've found the e-book you're looking for in our local catalogues and are connected to the campus network via VPN? Perfect, now you're as good as done.

Klick the **Full text** button that shows up beneath the respective title.

You should be transferred to the publisher's website. Some publishers (like Springer) allow you to download the complete book while others (utb, for example) offer the download of single chapters.



You can also easily read the texts online without downloading them.

There's no loan period for e-books. Once saved, you can keep the PDF files for non-commercial use.
